(MANY LISTED PLANTS & TREES HAVE FIRE DAMAGE)

FRONT YARD

ORNAMENTALS & NUT

- Hazelnut, Filbert tree/shrub
- Strawberry Tree (Artibus Unedo)
- Fragrant Tea Olive Tree, (Osmanthus Fragrums).
- Crepe Myrtle, three. Lavender (one?) and white (two?) Now large shrubs.
- Coastal Redwood, (Sequoia Sempervirens). Coming back from base.

BACK YARD

ORNAMENTAL PLANTS & TREES

- Two Cedar trees, rear yard.
- Camperdownii Elm, (Ulmus glabra). Rare and from seed 1979. Fire damaged but alive.
- Grape Hyacinth, (Muscari). Hundreds naturalized throughout backyard.
- Bluebells (Hyacinthoides) Naturalized.

- Candy Tuft, (White Iberus Semperverins). Near lily pond.

FRUIT & NUT PLANTS & TREES

- English walnuts, two. Delicious walnuts. Not grafted, and from an experimental, old orchard. One intact, one coming back from the base.
- Fig, green. (Conadria? Kadota? Adriatic?)
- Gravenstein apple tree, rear yard.
- Lemon tree, Eureka or Lisbon.
- Kiwis on damaged arbor.
- French Prune, rear yard.
- Apple Gazebo, Beverly Hills, Gala, Granny Smith, Grimes Golden, Red Fuji.
Very fire damaged. Not sure how many or which varieties survived. Rear yard.
